University of Saint Mary Disc Golf Course



USM Disc Golf

The disc golf course on Saint Mary's campus is an eighteen-hole course made up of nine Lightning DB-5 disc golf baskets with two tee boxes per hole. Golf discs are available for loan from the Athletic Department or for sale by Kevin Montgomery.

The map on the reverse side is a general map and is not to scale. To find the "tee box" to throw from look for a landscape timber at ground level painted parking lot/curb yellow. Throw from the marker. Count each throw as one stroke until your disc rests in the basket or in the chains, hitting it and bouncing off does not count, nor does landing on top of the chain assembly. Each subsequent throw should be made with one foot within a twelve inch square behind where the disc thrown had just landed. A marker disc (mini) can be placed directly in front of the thrown disc prior to picking it up and the next throw can take place behind the mini if you so choose, otherwise the thrown disc is not to be moved until the next throw is complete. The total number of throws is the score you have for that hole. The lowest score after totaling all holes thrown is the winner. Just like scoring in ball golf.

All roads are out-of-bounds on all holes and come into play several times, like the road next to Saint John's Hospital on #2 and #3. ***Please be careful of oncoming traffic and pedestrians before throwing.*** If you land out-of-bounds you must bring your disc to the last point it was in-bounds and take a one-stroke penalty. The cemetery is also out-of-bounds. Trees are a hazard as well. If you find your disc stuck in a tree there is no penalty but you must throw from directly under the point it was lodged in the tree. Of course, in a casual game as you are learning to play, these rules are up to the members of the group playing. There are professional level players and sanctioned tournaments all over the world where these rules as well as others are enforced as a condition of play. But as far as this golfer's concerned, the object of the game is to have fun first and scoring well is a bonus.

Once you have played at Saint Mary why not take a run into Kansas City and try one of the ten+ permanent courses developed and maintained by the Kansas City Flying Disc Club and local parks and recreation departments.
